



From the vicarage

One of the joys of retirement, according to 80's pop star turned radio presenter, writer, strictly contestant and now retired parish priest the Reverend Richard Coles, is being able to stand back from the church's debates. "When one erupts," he wrote not long ago, "it's like walking past a pub you used to drink in and seeing someone throw a chair through the window: startling, but not your problem."

I wouldn't know - I'm not there yet. I think I know what he means - but these debates aren't trivial, which probably explains why the Church of England's troubles seem to keep making headlines.

But more about retirement. I've had the seminar: Move away from your last parish when you retire, so that the new priest gets a fair chance to make a go of things... If you're asked to help in a church somewhere, remember - you're NOT the vicar ... Don't hoover up all the funerals at the local crematorium and expect to be popular — the list goes on. And now I've spoken with my boss, completed the paperwork, and received an email asking me to get on with telling everyone when it's happening.

And so here it is: I shall retire as Priest-in-Charge of the Parish of Alkham with Capel le Ferne and Hougham in the autumn, when I reach age 70. My last Sunday will be 28th September - the 23rd anniversary of my Ordination as a priest.

"The Fruit of the Spirit," St Paul wrote, "is Love, Joy and Peace." Debates aside, there really are churches near you where Christians are trying to live that out through prayer, caring for others, running lunch clubs, supporting food banks and so on. Sadly, things like that don't usually make headlines... Brian

Smart meters record your energy use and automatically send the meter readings. Please ensure you still do checks at the meter and its location for Gas leaks.

Smell gas? Call the Gas Emergency Services on 0800 111 999

Turn off your gas

If you think you have a gas leak, you need to turn off your gas supply at the meter.

- 1. Find your emergency control valve. In newer houses, the emergency control valve is normally outside with the gas meter in a meter box. If it's not there, try looking under the stairs, beneath the kitchen sink or in the garage.
- 2. Turn the handle so the lever is at 90 degrees to the upright gas pipe.

Next steps

- 1. Open all your doors and windows to let gas out and some fresh air in.
- 2. Don't switch anything electrical on or off.
- 3. Put out all naked flames. Don't smoke, strike matches or do anything which could make the gas catch fire.
- 4. If you have any electrical security entry phones or locks, don't use them. Open your doors manually.



 - Quotes received and a 3-year contract agreed with Harmer and Sons for cutting verges and field.
 - Waiting quote for strimming St Mary's Churchyard.
- ➤ <u>Land Gifted to Parish Council</u> Land Registry documents received and to be signed by Councillors, to complete transfer.
- Additional street lighting request for Old Dover Road Kent Highways reviewed crash data over five-years. It shows no recorded personal injury crashes to warrant installation. Councillors to decide if to add this into Village Highway Improvement Plan. Further investigation required, should Parish Council budget allow.
