





From the vicarage

With 8 May 2025 marking the 80th anniversary of VE Day, and events and activities planned up and down the country to commemorate the end of World War II in Europe, I've been reminded of a story that I heard during my student days.

Our tutor told us of how at his church one Remembrance Sunday, a young curate had stood up to preach. Beginning his sermon by inviting the congregation to picture a scene from the Battle of the Somme, he was soon interrupted as an elderly man leapt to his feet. "Young puppy!" he snarled as he stormed out. "I was there!" A cautionary tale that I've always remembered when writing my own Remembrance Sunday sermons — for preachers, anything that involves relating what others might remember has to be done with special care.

I've heard one preacher begin by describing how, during the war, he had been shot at by a German aircraft – he had been in his pram at the time. But the most memorable was from an old priest who had studied in Germany before the war. He began by quoting from the Old Testament: "Do not forget the LORD, and his righteousness." Describing his own memories of life in 1930s Germany, he spoke of how some friends had invited him to go to a meeting one evening – one at which Hitler himself would speak. From the pulpit, he described what he remembered of what he had heard. His conclusion: the world had gone on to pay a terrible price for forgetting the LORD and his righteousness.

Perhaps understandably, the main theme of the 80th anniversary of VE Day events will be one of celebration. But let's also remember those who work for peace and reconciliation in today's world. ... Brian





Chairperson's Report May 2024 – April 2025

Play Equipment and Recreation Field.

The skate ramps and landing surfaces have been renewed. A new zip wire plus various other defects have been dealt with when reported during the year. The tree heights and boundaries, after a survey, have also been dealt with by a contractor. Thanks go to Keith and Jamie for regularly checking the play equipment and recreation area.

Speed Watch.

These have continued to be carried out, weather permitting, on a regular basis with shorter hourly sessions when very cold. Cllr. Sam Pilcher is now the Delegate for this. The Police van has been attending regularly. All results of sessions are available on Parish Council Website.

Grapevine Newsletter.

Maureen has continued to do a sterling job every month, except January, to make sure this is out on time and all contributions are received to inform residents of events etc. Thank you to her and everyone involved in the distribution.

Highways Improvement Plan.

Installation of the drop kerbs, which have been done but without tactile paving, ongoing. Workmanship was poor with slabs lifting in some places – this was finally redone in October 2024. Ongoing issue with tactile paving in Beatrice Road. Yellow lines finally agreed after consultation, but the delay meant an increase in price when implemented.

The 2025 plan is now being discussed to identify what needs to be included, and an online meeting with Community Engagement Officer, Kent Highways is due to take place on 22 April.

Resilience Plan.

The plan is available on the website. It needs to be reviewed this year to update the information. Assistance is now available to help create a plan that is more user friendly.

This was a successful event with Senior Police Cadets doing the marshalling to the Battle of Britain Memorial for the beacon lighting.





Have Your Say on New Public Spaces Protection Order

Dover District Council is looking to review rules on dog control and anti-social behaviour in a new Public Spaces Protection Order – and your views are sought. Dover District Council is proposing to introduce a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) in accordance with the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 which if approved, would continue to cover the following behaviours:

- > Failing to remove dog faeces;
- > Not keeping a dog on a lead in a designated dogs on lead area.
- > Not putting, and keeping, a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer.
- > Permitting a dog to enter land from which dogs are excluded.
- > Street drinking
- > Unauthorised camping

The current Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) covers dog control and anti-social behaviour. It is proposed that a new PSPO is made with amendments to locations where restrictions apply.



The first Village Newsletter was published in April 1994 and was called "CAPEL NEWS".

The two-page edition included entries from the Parish Council announcing:

- The "Le Tour" cycle race would be passing through village, along the old A20, preceded by a carnival. The closure of New Dover Road between 7am and 12noon, meant residents on the seaward side of the main road will only be able to get in and out via Avondale Road crossing.
- A return visit from Oye Plage being organised, with a weekend of competitions and fun.
- Other entries included in the newsletter were from: Gardeners' Association, Over 60's Club, Short Mat Bowls Club, Crimewatch Statistics and Capel with Hougham (afternoon) WI and Capel Evening WI.

In this issue, a request was made to suggest a "snappy name" for the newsletter.

In the May 1994 publication

- It was made known, the first issue had proved to be successful and more contributions were received.
- Only one person suggested a name for the magazine of "**The Grapevine**", put forward by a Margaret Smith and so the name was adopted.
- Other entries added to the publication from: Cancer Research Jumble Sale (raising £340), Youth Club for 10/16-year-olds, Playgroup, Baptist Church, Village Hall, Primary School and Neighbourhood Watch.
- The Parish Council Chair's Annual Report 1994, highlighted: the opening of the new A20 (reported a vast improvement to traffic conditions in the village ... !!!), consideration of traffic calming measures on New Dover Road (not a high priority for KCC now as not a principal route and only a few vehicles appear to travel at excessive speed, so the situation will be monitored ... !!!), complaints from residents about New Dover Road grass cutting by KCC, drainage problems, additional street lighting, vandalism of play equipment, opening of Battle of Britain Memorial Site (July 1993), Twinning with Oye-Plage continues to develop, improvement of Satmar pond and concessionary travel tokens and bus permits.

And, so it continues! ... Chair's Annual Report for 2025 on Page 11.

This brief historical summary highlights:

Some changes, some for the good of our village and some not.

From inception as a single A4 sheet newsletter with just print and no illustration, to a now 20-page booklet with photos and graphics.

Still a way of spreading information about village activities to all, even with the conception of social media, that not everyone has access to.

This leads the Parish Council on to a discussion that Councillors had at their last meeting. "They are considering to only produce and have printed the Grapevine Newsletter every two (2) months".


