



From the vicarage

As we marked the 80th anniversary of VE Day recently, we celebrated a generation who are passing into history. Not only did they go through the War; they learned Bible stories at Grandmother's knee, and went to Sunday School. In the Forces they attended Church Parade. When the war ended, some trained as clergy; one, Robert Runcie, having served as a tank commander in Normandy and been decorated for bravery, went on to be Archbishop of Canterbury. In the 1950s, they flocked to Wembley to hear the evangelist Billy Graham preach. But then came the 1960's, and massive social changes. Following generations didn't catch the same churchgoing habit, and now, as a generation passes on and pews empty, some wonder how much longer the dear old C of E will last.

And yet... I'm reading Lamorna Ash's book *Don't Forget We're Here Forever*. The shocking news that a comedy double-act from her university days had not just found faith, but planned to be ordained as Anglican priests led her not only to interview them in preparation for her book, but to set out on a journey that took in Christian retreats and church visits across the country. On the way she encountered a range of Christian traditions and met others of her own generation who had also found faith. As she explored what it was that had stirred within them, she found something stirring within herself.

Recently, I heard of a local church that I'm told is lively, exciting and full of young people. A recent report by The Bible Society suggests that churchgoing may actually be increasing among the 18-34 age group. This Revival hasn't quite reached us yet — we're having to trim some of our services from this month - but there's hope, nevertheless ... *Brian*

Last month we had our first "Bus Trip" - to Canterbury. The weather was wonderful and we spent a fun day walking around Canterbury, seeing the ducking stool, the Westgate Gardens and two recent statues in the High Street.

Our meeting included a visit from George Ward of Cheesemakers of Canterbury. George explained their name. Had they named the business Canterbury Cheesemakers, Google would automatically take you to sites in Canterbury New Zealand! George told us a little about the history of cheese and how it has change now that we have refrigeration. At the beginning of WWI most of our cheese was imported from Australia and New Zealand, by the end of the war supplies were running desperately low. Therefore, when WWII started cheese was rationed from 1941 until 1954! Samples of many of the cheese George sells, were shared around and cheese was available to purchase.

After a break for refreshments, we had "members' time". This can be a quiz or a game; this month we had a "3-minute chat" session. This involves everyone sitting opposite each other in two rows and for 3 minutes discussing a given topic, after 3 minutes one side moves along a chair and another 3-minute discussion starts! Topics included my favourite chocolate bar; if money was no object, I would like to visit....; favourite book; favourite band. Great fun and an opportunity to speak to everyone!

They were told the dog they wanted was already sold, but that they could enter a contract to buy another dog and have it trained by the seller. The resident checked the seller online and agreed to pay a large deposit. After a couple of months, the seller stopped responding to the resident. They eventually found the seller had multiple CCJs outstanding and was clearly falsely advertising the dogs and training. Be very careful when buying a pet online. We have received numerous reports of courier fraud / police impersonation

In Birchington, Canterbury, Hadlow, Herne Bay, Longfield and Ramsgate. Residents have been getting phone calls from criminals impersonating the Police. The criminals used the names 'DC Frost', 'DC Benson' and 'DC Johnson', saying they are from Hammersmith Police and Met Police. One resident was told someone was in custody with their bank card Another was told a man had been arrested with cloned cards A third person was told to call 999 to speak to police Unfortunately, one resident followed the criminal's instruction to withdraw several thousand pounds which were collected by a courier as part of an investigation. One resident was told the caller was their bank, they asked for his bank details and told him to put his 'compromised' bank card in an envelope to be collected by a courier. The Police would NEVER telephone and ask for your bank card and PIN to be collected by a courier, to withdraw cash, or buy gold to assist in an investigation. Always check the dialling tone after your call to ensure scammers are not still on the phone. Use another telephone if possible or call a trusted friend first. If you have been a victim of this scam, contact your bank immediately by calling 159 and report it to Kent Police on 101.

The away match against Brenzett saw us come away with a 16-14 win.



There are planned matches through June, July, August & September still to play. Look out for more results. Good luck to all players.




