


The committee are currently recovering from the Garage Safari whereby in the hall kitchen, we sold over 350 rolls, nearly a hundred slices of cake, and I don't know how many cups of tea/coffee and soft drinks. We sold out by 12.30pm. In all we took nearly £1,500 on the day through the kitchen, stalls etc all of which goes to the running to the hall. If I tell you it takes £1,400 a month just to keep the hall running, you will understand how important the Safari is to the hall and by extension, the Village.

Another important aspect of Hall life is the Annual General Meeting (AGM), this year being held before our Committee Meeting on Tuesday, 2nd December. It starts at 7pm and all residents of the village are welcome to attend. Among other things at the AGM, we also vote in new committee members or trustees. The trustees work on behalf of the Village to maintain the Hall and to run activities aimed at fostering community life. If you are not yet a member and would like to be, membership is just a low £12.00 per year.


The society holds a Rose show in June, Spring, Summer and Autumn Shows, at the Village Hall. See "What's On" front page for dates.

Kent Downs National Landscape is working in conjunction with Asian Hornet Alert, to help distribute monitoring traps for this invasive non-native species across Kent. This pilot project called Making Trapping Happen, is aimed at helping farmers, landowners and smallholders monitor the threat of Asian Hornets, which prey on honeybees, bumblebees, hoverflies, and butterflies - all vital for pollination and healthy crops.

We are helping to distribute Asian Hornet Alert selective traps which are designed for monitoring only and are not kill traps. The lid holes allow insects to investigate the sugary bait inside and fly out, but keep hold of Asian Hornets. If one is caught and it is verified through the Asian Hornet Watch app, Asian Hornet Alert volunteers set up an open bait station nearby to work out where the nest is.

Early detection is key, which is why we'd love your help in recording any sightings through the Asian Hornet Watch app or get involved by applying for a free trap, dedicated webpage

www.kentdowns.org.uk/making-trapping-happen it will provide you with more information, including how you can apply for a free trap and where you can collect these from across the Kent Downs.
