#### CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of some items discussed at meeting held
Tuesday, 18<sup>th</sup> November 2025



#### Requests from public and Other Feedback:

- Chevron signage Capel Street junction Hockley Sole.
- ➤ Double yellow lines/stop signs junction Alexandra and Victoria Road.
- Lorries in Layby outside old Café just before Royal Oak

#### **Matters Concerning the Parish:**

➤ Flooding - Capel Street/Lancaster Avenue:

Another positive meeting held with KCC, following supply to them of; surveys, reports, letters, photos and 2 scheme options. KCC considered these to be good evidence and will now carry out their own top survey and modelling work on the options suggested.

A further meeting arranged for second week of April, when hopefully one of the schemes will be agreed. Thanks, expressed to Cllrs. Harris and Norris for their work on this. A deep cleanse of the Lancaster Avenue/Playing Field drains to take place within the next 2 weeks.

➤ Land Gifted to Parish Council:

The two new benches now received and waiting installation. Wording on plaques, on respective benches, to be considered.

➤ <u>DDC owned Street Lighting:</u> Repairs to be chased with DDC.

#### Planning:

- ➤ Recent applications received; Resolution agreed on response to Lorry Park Proposals.
- ➤ <u>All planning application documents and comments</u>
  Available to view on Dover District Council website:

#### **Neighbourhood Watch (NHW):**

Anti-social pavement parking by several vans, causing issues with mobility/pushchair users, having to use the roads to pass, especially Capel Street.

### **<u>CCTV/ICT</u>**: Nothing to report **Playing Field and Equipment**:

- ➤ Refurbish paintwork on MUGA (multi-use goal area) programmed. Waiting for a period of dry weather!!
- ➤ BMX trail-bars to be removed on contractors list.

#### **Traffic Management and Highways:**

- ➤ Vehicle activated signs (VAS), on New Dover Road (B2011): Waiting installation date from Kent Highways. Estimated to be approx. 12-14 weeks.
- ➤ <u>Drop kerbs</u>, <u>Beatrice Road</u>: Retrospective tactile paving and additional drop kerbs scheduled date for installation 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026.
- ➤ <u>Hurst Lane</u>: Highway marked for additional pothole repairs. Councillor to wait until this work is done and then again check surface works carried out.
- Diversion signs M20/A20 Roundhill Tunnels closed. Having re-addressed this issue, information received was: unfortunately, the funding situation which affects our request for extra signage was not good news, but we can only keep pushing. Councillors to obtain photographic evidence to pursue.

- ➤ No replies received to any reports logged.
- ➤ Muddy season now entering.
- ➤ Footpath to Warren still closed. Two other routes still available to partly access, except to the "apron area."

#### **New Smishing (text) Scam Alert!**

There have been new reports of criminals sending fake text messages claiming to be from the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency (DSVA). These texts issue fraudulent illegal parking notices and ask victims to click malicious links to pay fines!

Warning Signs of the DSVA Scam You receive a text message claiming you have parked illegally and owe a fine. The text message includes a link to "pay fine now" or "view fine details." Threats of extra charges or legal action if you do not act quickly or offer of a reduced fine if you pay within a limited time frame! Poor spelling or grammar mistakes in text messages received. How to Protect Yourself:

Know that the DSVA does not issue parking fines by text message.

- \*\*Do not click on links in suspicious texts.
- \*\*Do not reply or share personal/banking details.
- \*\*Check official DSVA or your local council websites for genuine notices.
- \*\*Forward scam text messages to 7726.
- \*\*Block and delete suspicious numbers.
- \*\*Keep your phone's security software up to date.




