Community Safety Newsletter – Reporting Anti-Social Behaviour

We've seen a noticeable increase in reports of anti-social behaviour across Dover, and we want to ensure everyone knows how to report incidents and help keep our community safe.

What Is Anti-Social Behaviour?

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) refers to actions that cause harassment, alarm, or distress to others. Common types include:

- Off-Road Motorcycles: Riding illegally on public land, pavements, or parks.
- **E-Scooters & E-Bikes**: Misuse in pedestrian areas, riding without insurance or helmets, or causing disruption.
- **Noise Nuisance**: Loud music, shouting, or disturbances at unsociable hours.
- Vandalism: Graffiti, property damage, or littering.
- Intimidating Behaviour: Groups loitering, verbal abuse, or threatening conduct.

Roads Policing

On 10th October, Officers from Dover Neighbourhood Team were joined by Officers from the Road safety Unit, Immigration and Dover District Council on a joint traffic operation along the A256 around Sandwich.

The purpose of the operation was to proactively target motorist who are not adhering to the road traffic act.

The day resulted in the following.

- 4x Traffic Offence Reports (TOR's) for overweight vehicles.
- 2x Vehicles prohibited for being overweight
- 2x TORs for defective trailer brake.
- 2x TORs for vehicle condition likely to cause injury
- 1x TOR for vehicle being in a dangerous condition
- 2x TORs for illegal number plates
- 4x TOR's for having no insurance policy in place.
- 2x seizures under S165 of the road Traffic Act.
- 2x Disqualified Drivers Stopped.
- 5x TORs for no MOT
- 4x seizures for no Tax
- 2x TORs for vehicle with an insecure load
- 4x Vehicles stopped for dark window tints and tints were removed.
- 1x TOR for a bold tyre
- 2x Section 59 warning.

So all in all a really positive day.
