Survey Season is Nearly Here Again!

Even though it feels like the rain is never-ending, spring really is on its way - and our rangers and volunteers are looking forward to another season of wildlife surveys in the brighter weather. Last year we recorded **13,281 individual butterflies** across our sites.

Topping the list was the **meadow brown**, with **2,452** sightings, and we're looking forward to seeing what this year brings.
